- Provide a safe and fun environment for the kids.
- Learn and follow all league rules, policies and procedures.
- Treat all players fairly.
- Put the feelings of the players ahead of your desire to win.
- Attend all league functions and participate in league activities.
- Communicate/distribute all league information to all players & parents.

City of Lincoln Youth Sports Coaches Code of Conduct & Expectations

I. I will place the emotional & physical well-being of my players ahead of a personal desire to win. Expected Behavior:

- Using appropriate language in appropriate tones when interacting with players, league officials, game officials, parents, and spectators.
- Including all players in team activities without regard to race, religion, color, sex, sexual orientation, body type, national origin, ancestry, disability, ability, or any other legally protected classification.
- Treating all players, league officials, game officials, parents, and spectators with dignity and respect.
- Playing all players according to the equal participation rules established by the league.
- Allow reasonable absences from practice.

II. I will treat each player as an individual, remembering the large range of emotional & physical development for the same age group.

Expected Behavior:

- Recognize the difference of each child and treating each player as an individual while demonstrating concerns for their individual needs and well being.
- Encouraging all players, regardless of skill level, to be included as a member of the team and to remain involved in sports.
- Recognize that some physical tasks, drills, and demands are not appropriate for all youth.
- Recognize that youth may vary greatly in physical, social, and emotional maturation and considering these factors when setting up competitions and when interacting with youth.

III. I will do my best to provide a safe playing situation for my players.

Expected Behavior:

- Maintain a high level of awareness of potentially unsafe conditions.
- Protecting players from sexual molestation, assault, and physical or emotional abuse.
- Correcting or avoiding unsafe practice or playing conditions.
- Using appropriate safety equipment necessary to protect all players.
- Seeing that the players are provided with adequate adult supervision while under the coach's care.

IV. I promise to review and practice the basic first aid principles needed to treat injuries of my players. Expected behavior:

- Keeping basic first aid supplies available in all practice and game situations.
- Recognizing and administering proper first aid to an injured player.
- Demonstrating concern for an injured player, notifying parents and cooperating with medical authorities.
- Protecting the player's well being by removing them from activity when injured and not returning them to activity if they are compromised by injury.

V. I will do my best to organize practices that are fun and challenging for all my players. Expected Behavior:

- Establish practice plans that are interesting, varied, productive, and aimed at improving all player's skills and individual abilities.
- Devoting appropriate time to the individual improvement of each player.
- Conducting practices of reasonable length and intensity appropriate for the age and conditioning of the players.

VI. I will lead by example in demonstrating fair play and sportsmanship to all my players. Expected behavior:

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- Adopting the position, teaching and demonstrating that it is our basic moral code to treat others as we would like to be treated.
- Abiding by and supporting the rules of the game as well as the spirit of the rules.
- Providing an environment conducive to fair and equitable competition.
- Using the influential position of youth coach as an opportunity to promote, teach, and expect sportsmanship and fair play.

VII. I will provide a sports environment for my team that is free of drugs, tobacco, and alcohol, and I will refrain from their use at all City of Lincoln youth sports events. Expected Behavior:

- Being alcohol and drug free at all team activities or in the presence of players.
- Refraining from the use of any type of tobacco products at team activities or in the presence of your players.
- Refrain from providing any type of alcohol, drug, or tobacco products to any of your players.
- Encouraging parents to refrain from the public use of tobacco products or alcohol at team activities.

VIII. I will be knowledgeable in the rules of each sport that I coach & I will teach the rules to my players. Expected Behavior:

- Becoming knowledgeable, understanding, and supportive of all applicable game rules, league rules, regulations, and policies.
- Teaching and requiring compliance of these rules among players.

IX. I will use those coaching techniques appropriate for each of the skills that I teach. Expected Behavior:

- Teaching techniques that reduce the risk of injury to both the coach's own players and opponents.
- Discouraging illegal contact or intentional dangerous play and administering swift and equitable discipline.

X. I will remember that I am a youth sports coach, and that the game is for children and not adults. Expected Behavior:

- Maintain a positive, helpful, and supportive attitude.
- Exercising your authority/influence to control the behavior of the fans and spectators.
- Exhibiting gracious acceptance of defeat or victory.
- Accepting and adhering to all league rules and policies related to the participation of adults and youth.
- Fulfilling the expected role of a youth coach to adopt a "kids first" philosophy.
- Allowing and encouraging the players to listen, learn, and play hard within the rules.
- Placing the emphasis on **fun**, **learning**, and **participation**.

This Code of Conduct defines the expectations for adults serving as coaches in youth sports and provides the tools to be used by the City of Lincoln Recreation Department when necessary, to check behavior and to respond with resolve to protect all children from psychological, emotional, physical, or social abuses that can be perpetrated against them by youth sports coaches. Coaches failing to adhere to this Code of Conduct may be subject to the following disciplinary actions. Coaches will have the right to appeal any disciplinary action within 7 days of notification. Appeals must be submitted in writing to the program supervisor.

- 1. Warning
- 2. Probation
- 3. One game suspension
- 4. Multiple game suspension
- 5. Season suspension
- 6. Permanent suspension
